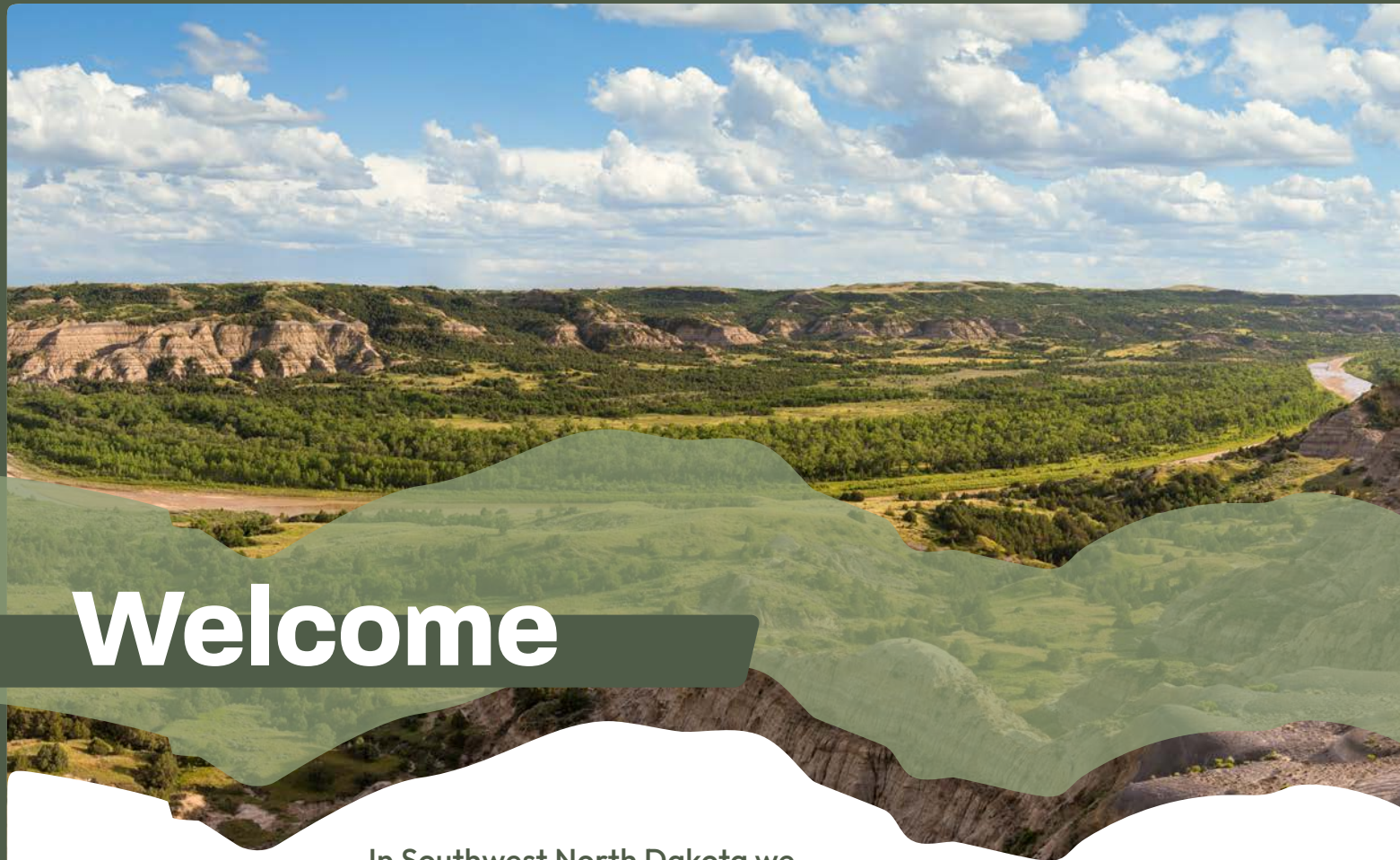

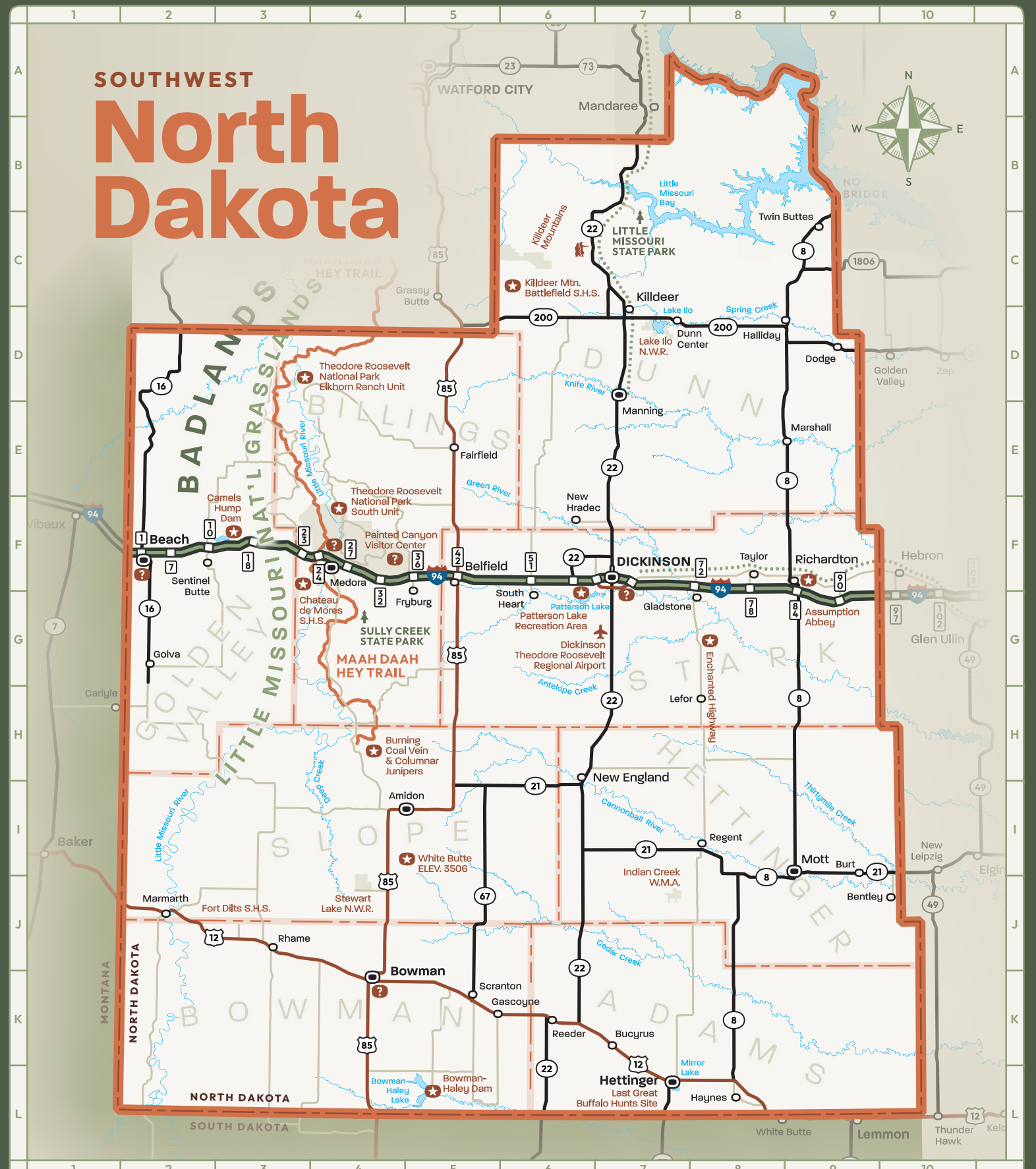

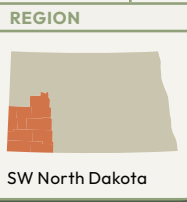

Killdeer Mountain Four Bears Scenic Byway

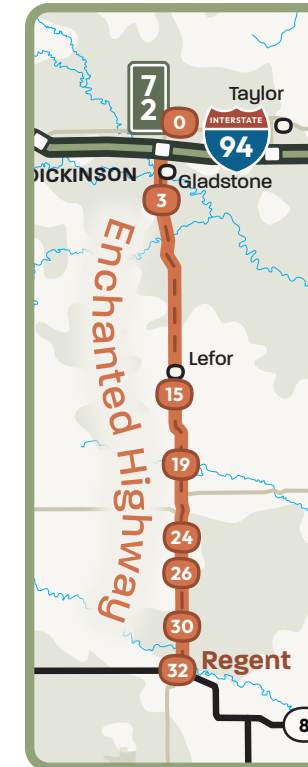
Start in Killdeer, ND

From the Killdeer Mountains to the deeply entrenched Little Missouri River Breaks and Badlands, this 64-mile byway provides a unique and enchanting landscape in one of the most scenic areas of western North Dakota. The rich culture and history of the Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara tribes along with the cowboy and rodeo lifestyles found here provide visitors an enthralling adventure in west-central North Dakota.

Enchanted Highway

Begins at Exit 72 on I-94 near Gladstone and terminates 32 miles down the road in Regent.

Old Red Trail Scenic Byway

Start in Dickinson, ND

Before highways, color-named trails crossed the U.S.—the Old Red Trail once ran from Seattle to NYC. Later becoming Highway 10, the route now parallels I-94. Known today as the Old Red Trail Scenic Byway, it offers a slower journey through small towns, museums,

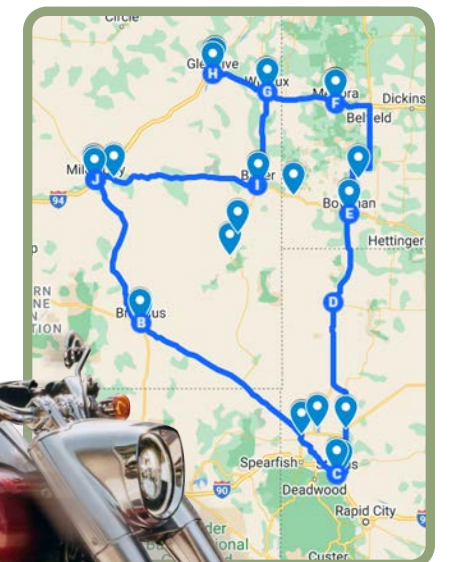
events, local shops, and pastoral landscapes. Watch for gravel stretches between New Salem and Glen Ullin or on the Curlew Loop near Almont. Enjoy wildlife, blue skies, and a relaxed pace along this historic route once traveled by Custer.



MonDak Motorcycle Loop

Start and finish your loop in Medora, ND!

Explore the great towns of Medora, Belfield, Amidon, Bowman, and Beach. Make sure to stop at White Butte, North Dakota's highest point, just outside of Amidon. This scenic motorcycle loop will take you through the western edge of North Dakota and South Dakota as well as the eastern edge of Montana. End your trip in Medora taking in Theodore Roosevelt National Park and all of the things historic Medora has to offer.

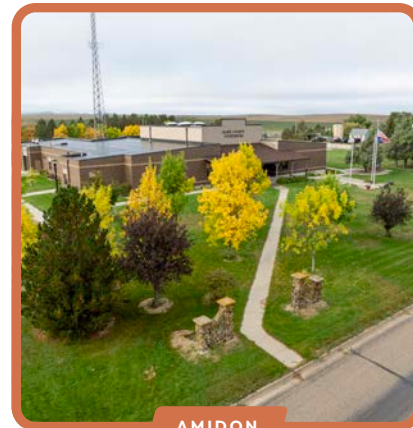

Amidon Slope County

Slope County Auditor 701-879-6276

Located in the center of Slope County, Amidon is recognized as the smallest county seat in the nation, with the town having around 30 residents. Despite its size, Amidon is surrounded by the stunning landscapes of the Badlands, offering breathtaking views and natural beauty. Visitors can hike White Butte, the highest point in North Dakota, and explore various outdoor recreational opportunities in the area.

Beach Golden Valley County

City Auditor 701-872-4103

Located on the North Dakota-Montana border, Beach wasn't officially part of North Dakota until land surveyors mapped it out in 1901. During its boom years in the early 20th century, Beach flourished with new schools, telephones, electric lights, and a series of grain elevators known as "prairie skyscrapers," earning it the title of the world's largest primary grain market. Although growth slowed after 1915, Beach settled into a steady pace, maintaining its quiet charm for over 90 years.

Belfield, Stark County, ND.

Belfield Stark County

City Auditor 701-575-4235

Originally established as Fort Huston in 1875, the settlement was later incorporated due to growth from the Northern Pacific Railroad. Today, known as the crossroads of the North American continent, travelers can journey east on I-94 to New York City or west to Seattle, Washington. U.S. 85 leads north to Alaska, part of the only intercontinental highway that stretches from Alaska to Mexico City, solidifying Belfield's status as a true gateway to the West.



Bowman Bowman County

City Auditor 701-523-3309

Depending on your direction of travel, Bowman is either the first or last town you'll encounter in the state. Highlights include its rich history, featuring prehistoric wonders, and fascinating glimpses into the ancient past. From fossil finds to the area's deep agricultural roots, Bowman blends the old with the new, offering visitors a unique small-town experience with plenty to discover.

Bucyrus Adams County

Adams County Auditor 701-567-4363

A small city in Adams County, founded in 1907 along the Milwaukee Road's trans-continental rail line. Originally named Wolf Butte and later Dolan, it was renamed Bucyrus in 1908 after the Bucyrus Company steam shovels used in constructing the railroad. As of 2020, the population was 18. Residents enjoy a close-knit community atmosphere amidst the expansive North Dakota plains.

Dickinson Stark County

City Auditor 701-456-7739

Known as the gateway to the western part of the state, Dickinson was established in the late 1800s, it has grown into a regional hub for commerce, education, and culture. With a diverse economy driven by energy, agriculture, and healthcare, Dickinson offers a range of amenities and services. The city features beautiful parks, recreational opportunities, and more making it an attractive destination for residents and visitors alike.

Dodge Dunn County

Dunn County Auditor 701-573-4448

A friendly little town with a big sense of pride. Located in western Dunn County, it's known for its welcoming spirit and strong community ties. Locals gather for community events, and kids love exploring the nearby hills. With room to roam and neighbors who know your name, Dodge is a reminder of what small-town living is all about.

With nearby access to Lake Ilo National Wildlife Refuge and a vibrant summer calendar, Dunn Center is the kind of place where you can hike in the morning, enjoy a community BBQ in the afternoon, and catch a gorgeous sunset to end the day.

Stark County Auditor 701-456-7630

Happy Rock, North Dakota, more commonly known as Gladstone, is a small community located in Stark County. Gladstone, ND, was founded in the spring of 1882 by settlers from Ripon, Wisconsin, and originally called Green River, later named after British Prime Minister, William Ewart Gladstone.



Golva Golden Valley County

Golden Valley County Auditor 701-872-4331

The city of Golva was founded in 1915 when the Northern Pacific Railroad made its way across the state. Its name combines "Golden" and "Valley" to reflect the region's expansive wheat fields. Once a bustling town with diverse businesses, Golva now retains a few essential services while preserving its small-town charm and agricultural roots.

Halliday Dunn County

City Auditor 701-938-4585

Founded in 1914, Halliday began as a beacon for settlers seeking new opportunities on the prairie, supported by the railroad's promise of growth. Although economic hardship during the Great Depression and later rail line closures posed challenges, Halliday's resilience kept it thriving while many neighboring towns declined. Today, this small community is known for its strong spirit, rooted in hard work and perseverance.

Fairfield Billings County

Billings County Auditor 701-623-4377

A small agricultural community in Billings County that embodies the spirit of rural North Dakota. Surrounded by open farmland and ranches, it's a place where hard work and neighborly values run deep. Located near the Little Missouri National Grassland, Fairfield offers some of the state's most picturesque landscapes, perfect for anyone who loves wide skies and the quiet rhythms of country life.



Fryburg Billings County

Billings County Auditor 701-623-4377

Tucked along the edge of the Badlands in Billings County, Fryburg is a quiet community with deep railroad roots. Once a bustling stop along the Northern Pacific Railway, today it's a peaceful place where prairie views stretch for miles. Haynes Adams County

Adams County Auditor 701-567-4363

Another small city in Adams County, established in 1906 as Gadsden and renamed in 1907 to honor George B. Haynes, then-president of the Milwaukee Road. The population was 15 as of the 2020 census. Despite its size, Haynes offers a peaceful rural lifestyle with a strong sense of community.

Hettinger Adams County

Nestled at the crossroads of Highways 12 and 8, just four miles north of the South Dakota border and seventy-five miles east of Montana, Hettinger sits at the heart of farm and ranch country and is the main hub of Adams County. Known for its prime location, Hettinger offers exceptional opportunities for hunting, fishing, and outdoor recreation.

Slope County Auditor 701-879-6276

Marmarth is a quaint, historic town near the Montana border, celebrated for its charming historic buildings and deposits of dinosaur fossils. Established in the late 1800s as a railroad hub, it now offers a quiet rural lifestyle. Nestled amidst picturesque rolling hills and vast prairies, Marmarth has become a destination for outdoor enthusiasts, drawing in adventurers and history buffs alike.

The largest city in Dunn County is a lively hub of western charm and outdoor adventure. 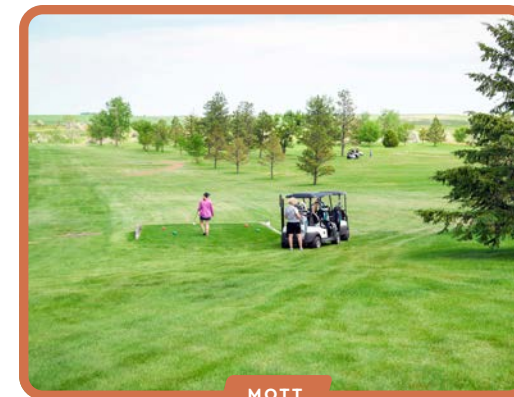

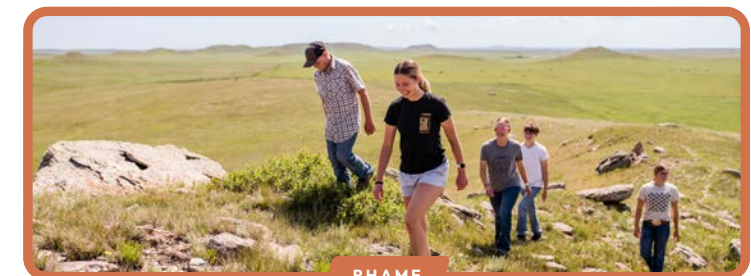

Sentinel Butte Golden Valley County

Golden Valley County Auditor 701-872-4331

Once a booming town in the early 1900s, now has about 50 residents but retains its charm. Key sights include the scenic Sentinel Butte (North Dakota's second-highest point), Camel's Hump, and Square Butte. Visitors enjoy a peaceful drive along Old Highway 10, taking in the area's natural beauty and landmarks.

Taylor Stark County

City Auditor 701-260-3902

Founded in 1881 as Antelope and renamed in 1882 after railroad official D.R. Taylor. Located along the Northern Pacific Railway, it became a key shipping hub for grain and livestock. Surveyed in 1883, the town grew around its railway station, supporting settlers heading north or south to neighboring counties.

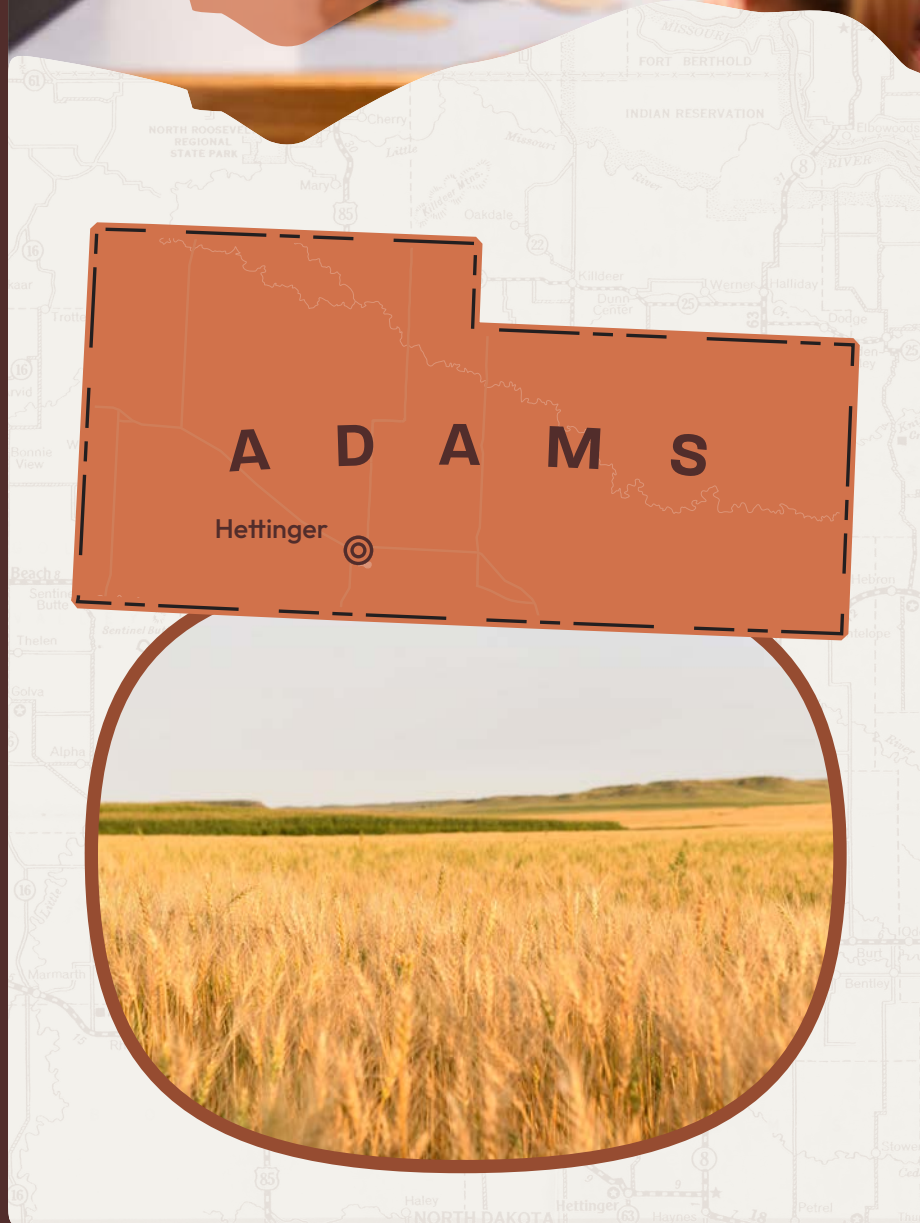
Dunn County Auditor 701-573-4448

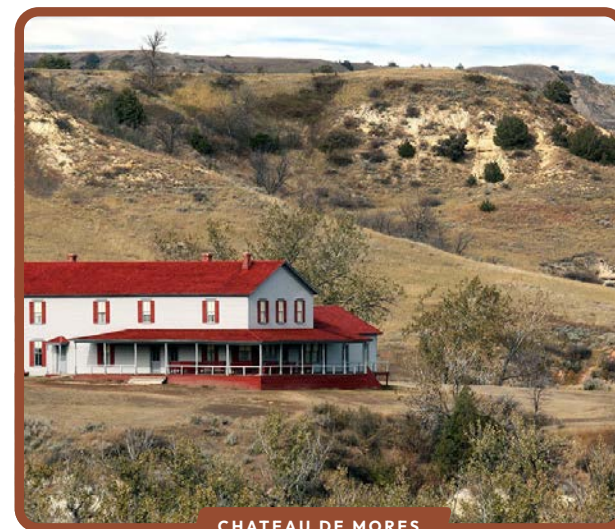


COWBOY HALL OF FAME

Chateau de Mores State Historic Site

Located southwest of Medora, this site honors Antoine de Vallombrosa, the Marquis de Mores, who arrived in 1883. His ventures included a beef packing plant, stagecoach line, freight company, refrigerated rail cars, livestock raising, land ownership, and the founding of Medora, named after his wife. Built in 1883 as a summer residence, the 26-room Chateau now serves as a historic house museum, preserving many original furnishings and personal belongings of the de Mores family.
